

Regulations VII IST Beer Challenge

Article 1 - General Principles

- 1. The VII IST Beer Challenge is a homemade craft beer competition organized by the Clube de Cervejeiros do Instituto Superior Técnico (CCIST), an autonomous section of the Instituto Superior Técnico Student Association (AEIST).
- 2. The competition is open to all individuals who produce homemade craft beer on a noncommercial basis.
- 3. All information about the competition will be shared on the CCIST website (https://clubecervejeiros.tecnico.ulisboa.pt/) and on the CCIST Instagram page (https://www.instagram.com/clube.cervejeiros.ist/).

Article 2 - Objective

- 1. The competition aims to foster interest in craft beer and promote homebrewing.
- 2. The competition provides participants with high-quality feedback on their beers and encourages cooperation and communication among various participating entities.

Article 3 - General Provisions

- 1. The competition follows the format and rules defined by the BJCP program (https://www.bjcp.org), and the beers will be judged according to the 2021 edition categories of the same organization.
- 2. The competition will have two categories:
 - a. **Ale Category** Any beer classified as an ALE according to the 2021 BJCP guidelines may compete.
 - b. **Special Category "Sours"** Any beer belonging to the groups: 23. European Sour Ale and 28. American Wild Ale.
- 3. The beers submitted must be original and homemade.
- 4. Participants must submit/send 3 bottles of 0.33L.
- 5. The bottles must not have any labels, tags, or visible marks that allow identification of the participant.
- 6. Bottles may differ from each other or show signs of wear.
- 7. The bottle caps must be plain and metallic, of any colour.
- 8. Beers belonging to the Special Category cannot compete in the Ale Category.

Article 4 - Registration

- 1. Registrations will be conducted online through the following form: https://forms.office.com/e/mNTLWWQS5N.
- 2. Registrations will be open until June 21, 2025.
- 3. Participants may register individually or in groups.
- 4. Each participant may enter as many times as they wish, by filling out the form the corresponding number of times.
- 5. A minimum of 10 participants is required for the competition to take place.

Article 5 - Beer Bottle Submission

- 1. Beers will be accepted between March 20, 2025, and June 27, 2025.
- 2. Along with the bottles, the recipe of the beer must be submitted, including the name assigned to the beer.
- 3. Beers can be sent by mail to Clube de Cervejeiros do IST, Avenida Rovisco Pais No. 1, 1049-001 Lisbon, or delivered in person at the AEIST secretariat between 9:00 AM 12:00 PM and 1:00 PM 5:00 PM.

Article 6 - Payment

- 1. Registration requires payment for the first entry, which costs €8, with an additional €2 for each extra entry.
- 2. Payment can be made in cash along with the delivery/shipment of the bottles or via bank transfer to PT50 0033 0000 45694819753 05. The proof of payment must be sent to ccist.sa@aeist.pt with the subject "PAGAMENTO IST BC," identifying the name of the beer.

Article 7 - Tasting and Awards

- 1. The beer tasting and judging will take place on June 28, 2025, and will not be open to the public.
- 2. Beer judging will follow the method recommended and certified by the BJCP.
- 3. Evaluation sheets will be sent to participants, and a ranked list of all submitted beers will be published.
- 4. All other participants will be represented by the name of their beer.
- 5. Three prizes will be awarded to the three highest-scoring beers in each category.
 - a. Prizes for the Special Category are subject to the number of entries in that category.
- 6. The prizes will be announced by the registration deadline on the CCIST website and Instagram page.

Note: If a group wins a prize, only one prize will be awarded per group.

Article 8 - Responsibility

- 1. Participants are responsible for ensuring their bottles arrive within the deadline and undamaged and for making the registration payment.
- 2. In case of disqualification or late delivery, CCIST is not responsible for refunding the registration fee and/or the submitted beers.
- 3. CCIST will store the bottles in a refrigerated chamber to ensure proper storage.

Article 9 - Omitted Cases

1. Any omitted case arising from this regulation will be duly considered and decided by the CCIST board.
